The School of Economics at Universidad del Rosario is one of the best of Latin America. The School has 27 permanent faculty members and 2 adjunct professors, who have obtained their PhD from top universities in the US and Europe, such as Stanford, Berkeley, UCLA, NYU, BU, Rochester, UCL, Tilburg and Toulouse.

The School has one of the most international faculties in Latin America, with professors from Argentina, Chile, Guatemala, Perú, Russia, Spain, and Turkey, as well as Colombia.



The School

The research conducted by the faculty has been published in leading journals such as: Review of Economic Studies, Journal of Economic Theory, AEJ: Applied Economics, Review of Economics and Statistics, Economic Journal, Management Science, Journal of Public Economics, Journal of International Economics, Games and Economic Behavior, Journal of Financial Economics, Journal of Development Economics and Journal of Empirical Finance.

The School has two weekly research seminars and weekly workshops in Macroeconomics, Finance, IO and Competition, Applied Microeconomics and Experimental and Behavioral Economics.

The School offers various degrees, including a PhD. in Economics, a Research Master in Economics, an MSc. in Quantitative Finance, an MA. in Economics of Public Policy. It also has two undergraduate programs (in Economics, and in Finance & International Trade).

Working Conditions

Faculty members are entitled to a competitive 12-month salary as well as generous monetary incentives for publications, which are increasing in the journal's quality. In addition, incoming faculty are entitled a generous research stipend. Every faculty member is offered a permanent contract and promotions are awarded on the basis of academic productivity.

On top of the School's research funds, faculty members are entitled to apply to University-wide research grants on a yearly basis.

Incoming faculty are expected to teach two courses during the first 3 semesters, and 3 courses per year thereafter. Starting on their second year, faculty members are expected to engage in some reduced administrative duties. International faculty are not required to teach in Spanish.
